Communicable Disease Prevention Plan

As we begin Step 3 of B.C.'s Restart Plan, Terminal City Club is excited to expand its business offerings to bring us back together.

In keeping with the Provincial Health Orders and the direction of WorkSafe BC, we are replacing our COVID-19 Protocol Plan with our Communicable Disease Prevention Plan; imbedded in our daily activities.

As you may know, the mask mandate order under the Emergency Program Act was lifted on July 1, 2021 and no proof of vaccination is needed. However, masks are recommended in public indoor settings for all people 12 and older who are not yet fully vaccinated. For this reason, and the safety of our team, the employees of Terminal City Club will continue to wear masks until further notice.

Step 1: Understand the Risk – We regularly monitor and review related information issued by the provincial health officer.

Step 2: Implement Practices and Policies to reduce risk -

	Practices are in place to support staff who may have symptoms of a communicable disease
	(e.g., fever, chills, coughing, etc.) so they can avoid being at work when sick Signage is in place as a reminder of the importance of regular and thorough handwashing;
	covering coughs and sneezes with elbow
	Hand-hygiene facilities with appropriate supplies are also available
	Workstations are routinely cleaned to ensure a clean working environment Ventilation systems are well maintained with filters changed regularly
	Employees are encouraged and supported with the time needed to receive vaccinations for
	COVID-19 and other vaccine-preventable conditions
	The Provincial Health Orders, advice and recommendations issued by the provincial health officer continue to guide us
Step 3: Communicate Practices and Policies –	
	Practices are in place, including signage to remind employees, vendors, contractors, etc., of the measures in place to prevent the spread of communicable disease
Step 4: Monitor and Update –	
	TCCs Health & Safety Committee members and other employees regularly help to identify and resolve related issues
	Workplace inspections (conducted by the Health &Safety Committee) are regularly
	scheduled; to ensure practices and policies are functioning and maintained
	Continuous monitoring of guidance, orders and recommendations issued by the provincial health officer occur regularly and prevention measures are updated accordingly
	Employees are made aware of how to raise health and safety concerns; signage also serves as a reminder
